#### **KQG's Meetings:**

We all do it to some extent, but it can be so detrimental to our joy. Have you heard the quote, "Comparison is the thief of joy."? If so, then you know what I am talking about. Instead of comparing your quilting to everyone else's, be proud of the fact that you are doing your best work right now. It's ok to inspired, but don't be intimidated!

#### 2. Don't Point Out Your Mistakes

It can be an automatic response, someone compliments our quilt and we immediately begin pointing out all the things that are wrong with it. I see this in my classes all the time and it makes me so sad. Instead of pointing out mistakes or dying a compliment, just say 'Thank You'.....or at the very least, say something like 'I had a fun time working on it'.

#### 3. Don't Forget the Purpose of Your Quilt

If you are getting frustrated with the quilting on your quilt, it may help to remember the purpose of your quilt. Chances are, the main purpose of your quilt isn't to give you an opportunity to berate yourself. Instead, think about the greater purpose that it will serve once it's finished, whether you are keeping it or giving it away. Changing your perspective may help you enjoy the whole process a little more.

And last but not least: (But Angela – that makes FOUR things to stop doing!)

### 4. Don't Forget That a Finished Quilt is Better Than a Perfect Quilt Top.

No one ever sat by the fire cuddled up under a quilt top. Pull out those unfinished quilt tops that you are afraid to quilt, and finish them!

I found Angela's words so encouraging! Often our guild meetings can be intimidating to new quilters. Instead, I hope that they will be inspiring and encouraging each one of us to be better at what we love. Come to our next meeting, take Dena's class, try the new quilt challenge or the block of the month.

## Block of the Month - *Dutchman's Puzzle*



#### Fabric Requirements:

Colour 1: Any Medium fabric

One square 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"

opportunity to buy whatever you would like. Don't forget to bring money along.

Colour 2: Any

One square 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"

Dark fabric

Colour 3: Tone One strip 3 1/8" x 32"

on Tone Then cut again into eight squares 3 1/8" x

(Provided by 3 1/8"

KQG)

#### Piecing Directions:

You will be making 'No Waste Flying Geese' which is a great method which is guick and economical.


- 1. On the back side of each Colour 3,  $3\frac{1}{8}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{8}$ " square (eight squares) draw one diagonal line.
- 2. With right sides of fabric together, lay two Colour 3 squares on top of the Colour 1 square. Set the drawn diagonal lines as shown.



3. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of line. (Note: If your machine does not have an accurate 1/4" inch foot, draw in your stitching lines. Repeat with Colour 2 square. Cut apart between lines. Press seams toward smaller triangles.



4. With right sides together, lay one of the Colour 3 squares on the sewn unit and **stitch a scant** ½" on both sides of line. Cut apart between lines. Repeat with the remaining units. Press toward smaller triangles. Cut off rabbit ears. Trim to 3 ½" x 6 ½" if necessary. (Eight Flying Geese).



5. To finish the block, sew together as shown below ensuring that darker Flying Geese form a pinwheel in the centre:
