Kenya Quilt Guild Meetings are held in the East Africa Women's League Headquarters in Nairobi.

Meetings are held, with few exceptions, on the 3rd Thursday of every month.

The Meeting commences at 10 a.m. Members and visitors are asked to gather at 9:30 a.m. to check in, browse the library, and chat. No meetings are held in the months of August and December.

Annual membership fee of Ksh. 1200 is due in January. Members must present their membership cards at the door. Individuals may come to KQG meetings as a guest no more than twice per year. Guests must be accompanied and signed in by a member. The guest fee is 100/.

To complete the RAINBOW QUILT we will require approximately 90 blocks (15" x 6"). So far we have received about 30.

Members are requested to bring in 3"x6" pieces of fabric (of any color) to the next meeting.

Charu will hold an open workshop on 20th April from 09.30-4.30 to work on sorting the fabrics and sewing them together to make up the remaining 60 strips we need.

We know that "many hands make light work", so please make the time to come to the workshop, even if it's only for an hour or two! The guild sewing machines will be available, but if you prefer to work on your own machine, please do bring it along!

More workshops will be planned as may be necessary to complete the quilt.

BEV'S QUILTING CLASSES - MAY 2010

These will be full day classes at 1000/- per class except for Hand Quilting which will be a half day class at 500/-. They will probably be held at the Shalom Centre, near the Junction, but if the groups are small we will hold them at my house in Loresho.

Short cuts

Card trick, 6 point star, Delectable Mountains, Drunkard's Path and others.

We will make samples of a few of these, some demonstration only. Mostly machine work; suitable for all levels.

Requirements: 3 or 4 fabrics, some contrasting, some matching, but different values. Machine etc

1 day – Tues 18th May

Quilt as you go

A quick method to make a quilt; and putting blocks together to get a ready to bind quilt.

Fast and furious! We will do a Drunkard's Path design but this can be used with any other block. This is mostly by machine, a tiny bit by hand; suitable for all levels. Quick, simple and versatile and good for beginner's as it grows very quickly.

Requirements: Backing, batting and strips of scrap fabric, machine and basic sewing equipment.

1 day - Wed 19th May

Appliqué

Similar to last time. Mostly hand work. Basic and 3-D

Requirements: 16" Background fabric, scraps, thread, freezer paper etc

1 day - Sat 22nd May

Lone Star

Machine construction, using strip piecing.

Requirements: 3 contrasting fabrics (about 1 meter each), background fabric, machine etc.

1 day - Mon 24th May

Celtic work

Using simple curves and symmetry, designing ones' own blocks - when you know how it really is easy!

Then using bias maker or other methods, the construction of the block, this is hand work.

Requirements: Drawing equipment, 16" square plain paper; Sewing equipment, 16" square background and 2 fat quarters contrasting fabric.

1 day - Wed 26th May

Hand quilting

Using the teaspoon method

Requirements: either a quilt top basted and ready to quilt, or a 20" top/batting/backing square, quilting hoop, quilting needles, teaspoon etc

1/2 day - Thurs 27th May
