Over the years her central focus has been to understand fabric relationships and an intense appreciation of traditional quilts and beautiful quilting surface design.

Alex is the author of 30 books in four languages selling near 1 million copies worldwide. Her quilts and instruction tips have also appeared in numerous magazines.

She is the National Spokesperson for Bernina of America, a promotional partner for Accu Quilt's Go!, as well as a designer of her own line of fabrics with P&B Textiles, and threads with Superior Threads. For 11 years, she served as host of "Simply Quilts" on HGTV. Alex is a founding partner of The Quilt Show.com, the world's first full-service interactive online video/web magazine created just for quilters worldwide.

Alex continues to be one of the most sought after instructors and lecturers in the international quilting and sewing industry. Alex has two children and lives in Northern California with her husband

2011 AFRICAN QUILT CHALLENGE

Every year, members of the Kenya Quilt Guild participate in a quilt challenge event. The quilt challenge for 2011 is to make an African Quilt. From our good friend Magie Relph has come the following challenge description:

You must use the name or idea of an African myth, legend, folk tale or god as a basis for a quilt. The quilt does not necessarily have to be pictorial i.e. showing the actual story of the legend. Think about the subject of the story and see if it can lead you to depict the idea of the story in a different way. Perhaps you could use certain traditional blocks to represent certain ideas? What about the use of colour to represent certain ideas? Blue- the sky, brown, red ochre- the earth; are simple colour translations. What about using symbols...

Your quilt can be **any shape** but **no bigger than 48sq inches in area**.

It must be completed on or before the 1st June 2011.

There will be a prize for the best quilt!

BUTTONS AND BOWS SALE

BUTTONS & BOWS at the Yaya Centre will be selling remnants of cotton quilting fabrics at the incredibly cheap price of 400/- per meter, from February 1st, until sale stocks are finished. These are end-of-bolt pieces so come in varying lengths and you have to be prepared to buy the whole piece - in other words they will not be cut into smaller pieces for you. The bonus is that, at this price, they are wonderful bargains for backing quilts.

To qualify for this special discount you will be required to show your 2011 membership cards.
