Kenya Quilt Guild Meetings are held in the East Africa Women's League Headquarters in Nairobi.

Meetings are held, with few exceptions, on the 3rd Thursday of every month.

Greetings,

I am the CEO of Global Change Inc, a US based nonprofit organization that provides safe, clean water and basic sanitation to people living in extreme poverty throughout our world.

We are currently raising funds for a village in the Central African Republic (CAR). A few ladies have been taught quilting and they are really enjoying it. These ladies have sent our organization 2 beautiful squares and we are hoping to put theses squares together with other squares from around the world to make a beautiful quilt that will be auctioned off and 100% of the proceeds will go to a new well for a village and a latrine for a school in CAR.

The first square is exactly 12 x 12 inches and the second is exactly 9 1/2 x 9 1/2 inches.

We would very much like for you to join us in this

project. We are seeking quilters from around the world to donate a square or squares to be added to this piece. The colors or patterns need not follow the design as the 2 squares the ladies sent from CAR, nor do the squares need to be batted.

We would like to have the donated pieces by

August 31st in order to have the quilt pieced together and to allow time for showing and promoting this fundraising project. The finished quilt will be auctioned in conjunction with World Toilet Day which is held on November 19th.

All quilts need to have a proper hanging sleeve. You can find information on how to have a hanging sleeve done in most quilting books - come and browse the Guild library- or look on the internet. Kenya Quilt Guild Exhibition 2010

Quilt Entry Instructions

All entries must have been completed since January 1, 2008, and must never have been shown at any previous KQG Exhibition. Each quilt must have a 4" hanger sleeve stitched across the top of the back, and a label bearing the owner's name must be sewn in the bottom right corner on the back. All entries must be clean and finished. Registration per entry is Ksh 200/= regardless of size for the first entry submitted, and 100/= for any subsequent entries. All first entries will be included in the exhibition. Should there be an insufficient number of first entries, the Exhibition Committee will select what pieces they wish to hang from secondary entries, and their determinations are final, not to be disputed.

All entries must be delivered at or before the KQG monthly meeting, September 16th. Get your entries in on time and win a free quilter's gift worth more than Ksh 1000/=!
